

Background Check Information Sheet

A homeless and transient shelter license may not be issued to any shelter if the applicant, any individual on the application as a licensee, or any managing member of the applicant has been convicted of a barrier crime pursuant to 7 AAC 10.905, unless granted a waiver by the Anchorage Health Department Director.

The Anchorage Health Department will conduct independent background checks. Instructions for shelters are as follows:

- 1. Determine who in your organization is required to receive a background check.
 - a. AHD will conduct independent background checks on the applicant, any individual on the application as a licensee, and any managing member of the applicant.
- 2. Obtain fingerprints.
 - Fingerprints may be obtained from any of the following businesses:
 <u>Fingerprinters Background Records and Information Alaska Department of Public Safety</u>
- 3. Prepare an envelope for the Anchorage Health Department.
 - a. Submit all fingerprints in one envelope along with a check for the number of background checks multiplied by \$48.25. For example, 4 background checks would amount to a check for \$193.00.
 - b. All checks must be made out to 'Alaska Department of Public Safety'.
- 4. Mail the sealed envelope or deliver it in-person to:

- a. If delivering in-person, the envelope should be handed to a Housing and Homeless Services staff member.
- b. This envelope must be received within 10 working days of AHD accepting the application.
- 5. After submitting the envelope, the Anchorage Health Department will forward the envelope to the Alaska Department of Public Safety. No action by the shelter is required at this time.
- 6. The Alaska Department of Public Safety will complete a criminal background check both local and national in scope, and provide results to the Anchorage Health Department.
- 7. The results of each background check will be used to determine whether the applicant, any individual on the application as a licensee, or any managing member of the applicant has been convicted of a barrier crime pursuant to 7 AAC 10.905.
- 8. If one of these individuals has been convicted of a barrier crime, AHD will review according to 7 AAC 10.905 and notify shelters if they must submit a Barrier Crime Waiver Application and have not already done so. Any barrier crimes less than 10 years old and any 'permanent' barrier crime will require a waiver.
- 9. The Anchorage Health Department Director will determine whether or not to grant a waiver based on all information provided in the Background Check Waiver Application.
