THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1. Anchorage Municipal Code section 2.30.035 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the section is not affected and therefore not set out):

A person wishing to speak before the assembly under "appearance requests" must file an appearance request with the municipal clerk

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AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY AMENDING ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTIONS 2.30.035 AND 2.30.040 TO INCLUDE INITIAL AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION AND ESTABLISH Α DURATIONAL LIMIT TOGETHER WITH APPEARANCE REQUESTS AT REGULAR ASSEMBLY **MEETINGS.**

This proposed ordinance is intended to enhance public involvement during the Assembly's regular meetings.

12 The ordinance adds back initial audience participation at the beginning of the regular 13 meeting agenda Section 9, which was removed by AO 2022-82, and provides a 14 15 predictable time frame for both Appearance Requests and Initial Audience 16 Participation. This change assures the public will have a set time frame to provide 17 comments to the Assembly regardless of when the public comment period commences. While current Code offers that Appearance Requests begin not before 18 19 5:15 p.m. and no later than 6:00 p.m., the proposed AO's objective is to allot a predictable 30 minutes of time in the aggregate for Appearance Request and Initial 20 Audience Participation at each regular meeting. Initial Audience Participation would 21 22 follow after Appearance Requests are completed and end after 30 minutes has elapsed, and then resume at the end of the meeting at Agenda Item 16. The 23 24 proposed ordinance also allows the Chair to ask that persons coming forward for 25 initial audience participation be those whom say, in good faith, they are not staying through the meeting until final audience participation. This standard would not be 26 27 very enforceable, but may discourage persons who clearly stay through the end of 28 Assembly meetings regularly from exploiting the initial audience participation time, 29 and allow the chair to let others speak first.

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I request your support for the ordinance.
